- **New Mills Helping Hands food bank**

When things get really tough, some people have to choose between heating their homes or feeding their families. Set up by the New Mills churches, Helping Hands is there for the worst times: weekly bags of food and contact information for other sources of help.

- **Stop Hate UK** was established in 1995 and is a registered charity. Their vision is raising awareness and understanding of discrimination and Hate Crime, encouraging its reporting and supporting the individuals and communities it affects.

Stop Hate UK runs the Stop Hate Line, a 24 hour 3rd party reporting centre for victims of Hate Crime in Derbyshire (other areas covered can be found at www.stophateuk.org/where) and the Stop Learning Disability Hate Crime helpline which operates across England and Wales. Their patron is Doreen Lawrence OBE.

- **Nepalese Children's Trust**

Kanchha Sherpa is a medical student from Melamchi, Nepal, who has just completed his final year at Manchester University. He will speak about his future plans to return to his village as their very first doctor and the needs of his people in the more remote areas of his country.
